

Chaplin Comment's by Fr Folmar




Having just celebrated the Octave of Christmas, and thus having reflected on the amazing mystery of Christ's birth by a Virgin, we know that it happened before St. Joseph and Mary lived together. Moreover, that Mary conceived Jesus by the Holy Spirit. Taken together, these clearly indicate that St. Joseph was not Jesus' biological father.

But that's just fine. Because St. Joseph is Jesus' father by adoption, not generation. Just like ours to God is by adoption. Thus, to highlight St. Joseph and his powerful intercession, Pope Francis recently declared this year to be a Year of St. Joseph in honor of the 150th Anniversary of his proclamation as Patron of the Universal Church. Our Holy Father, Pope Francis, said that we are to "perpetuate the entrustment of the whole Church to the powerful patronage of the custodian of Jesus" in "committing ourselves 'with prayer and good works, to obtain, with the help of St. Joseph, .. comfort and relief from the serious human and social

Council Hall Renovation


Will be the featured article next month
